Third Cohort Fellowship Announcement

Bahir Dar University is implementing a five-year national project titled “USAID Response Leadership Activity” in partnership with 11 public universities, 7 ATVETs and three key host organizations. The project signed on July 27/2022 to be implemented for five years and it is on the second year of implementation. This project aimed to build the next young generation of Disaster Risk Management (DRM) professionals by equipping them with the skills that they need through a two years fellowship program to actively engage in the Disaster Risk Management system. As it is known, in the **first and second COHORT** fellowship program, 300 fellows of Disaster Risk Management and related graduate professionals were allocated at various levels of Government organizations, and fellows received short-term training to improve their skills and competencies and to get ready for their workplace skills. The **Third COHORT** fellowship program will host 150 fellows graduated from Partner Universities in different fields of study based on the host organization demands during human resource need assessment. The application for USAID Response Leadership Activity’s Third Cohort fellowship program is open to all **applicants graduated from partner universities** regardless of their race/ethnicity, age, religion, geographic location, socioeconomic status, disability, or gender identity.

Fellowship Approach:

- The fellowship program aims to build the next young generation of Disaster Risk Management and related professionals who are capable enough to shoulder the current Disaster Risk Management demand of Ethiopia and to fill the professional gap in the sector.
- During the two years fellowship program, fellows will have a chance to build their capacity through short-term tailor made trainings, on job training, professional development, Disaster Risk Management Leadership opportunity and networking in their work place.
- The program will provide monthly stipend to cover the expenses of successful fellows for two year (24 months).
- The fellows will be provided short term tailored and work related capacity building training and placed in different Government organizations to practice and improve their professional skills through on job training, and mentorship.

Eligibility Criteria

- **Recent Graduates:** The most recent first-degree graduates of 2014 E.C (2021/22), 2015 E.C. (2022/23), and 2016 E.C. (2023/24 from the 11 project partner universities: Ambo University, Arba Minch University, Bahir Dar University, Gambella University, Hawassa University, Jigjiga University, Jimma University, Mekelle University, Samera University, University of Gondar, and Wollo University in eligible fields of study graduated
- **Exit exam certificate:** For the last two years graduates (2015 & 2016 E.C or 2023 and 2024 G.C) who pass and can provide the Ministry of Education Exit Exam certificate.
- **BA/BSc graduates: Only First Degree graduates** with Disaster Risk Management and Sustainable Development, Health Officer, Public Health, Occupational Safety and Health, Plant Science, Animal Science, Natural Resource Management, Geography and environmental studies, Environmental Health Science, Environmental Science, Food and Nutrition, Management, Economics, Water Resource and Hydraulics Engineering, Information Communication Technology/ICT and Computer Sciences.
- **Unemployed youth:** Candidates who are unemployed and can provide unemployment letter from authorized government offices (Residence Kebele Administration).
- **Language Proficient:** Candidates who are proficient in reading, writing, listening and speaking English. Candidates who are proficient in reading, writing, listening and speaking working language of the country and the specific working language of the respective region/location.
- **Female applicants are highly encouraged to apply.**

Expected Commitments of fellows

- Willing to work with any **Government organizations** at all levels in Ethiopia, particularly at woreda level.
- Willing to work in **remote areas** where vacant positions are available, particularly at zone and woreda level.
- Able to work cooperatively in diverse groups and to respect the culture, norms and opinions of others in the workplace
- Willing to prepare weekly timesheet and monthly reports reflecting learning and job experiences.
- Willing to adhere to the project, partner universities and their host organization code of conduct, values and principles.

THIRD COHORT FELLOWSHIP APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

USAID Response Leadership Fellowship program application will be **available online** in the Application form from July 22 to August 11, 2024 and offline/manual application at partner universities from July 29 to August 09, 2024. The online portal is where you will complete and submit your application and it will allow you to directly upload required application supportive documents and letter of unemployment. Instructions on how to use the form, save your change, and submit your application are provided within the application. The online application can be conducted using computer, tablet, or smart phone with internet connection. Only Applicants who fully complete the online applications will be considered. Applications must be submitted online through the application portal and offline submission (in-person application) based on the stated schedule. Any application submitted through email or other social media platforms will **NOT** be considered.

- Applicants are required to read the application call and check their eligibility before applying.
- Applicants who fulfill the eligibility criteria in the application call are required to “Sign In” to your google account to complete the application form using their user account and password.
- It is not mandatory to finish your application in one session. - Please fill in your **CGPA** that you achieved. Note to fill in the correct CGPA that you obtained, and you are required to attach the diploma and student copy as supportive documents. **Filling wrong information** will led the candidate to be **disqualified**.
- Please fill the year when you graduated or obtained your degree. When you click on the year of graduate section it will give you the list of the years eligible for this fellowship program. The application portal is restricted and only the eligible years of graduation are available. If your year of graduation is not among the listed years to select that means you are **NOT** eligible to apply.

2.2. Languages

English language proficiency is required for participation in the USAID Response Leadership Program. Most of the activities of the fellowship program will be conducted in English, including academic sessions, trainings, and email communications. Please tell us about your English proficiency and also other language skills (speaking, listening, writing, and reading). In addition, to the languages listed in the section you can list other languages on the space with "Other".

Step 4: Personal Statement

This section of the application is very crucial and your responses to the following questions are critical in distinguishing yourself from other candidates and identifying your current leadership traits and your desire to participate in the program. Please note that the response for each question has a specified word limit and your answer must be to the point in answering your questions. If your answer is more than the world limit the application portal will not allow you to save and you have to ensure your answer is within the world limit. You must use your own words and **DO NOT PLAGIARIZE** your answers. Plagiarism is forbidden and those who plagiarize their application materials will be disqualified.

Step 5: Preferred Exam Center

Successful candidates who pass the first-round selection process will be invited for entrance exam/Interview. To minimize the cost of transport for candidates the exam will be conducted in clusters based on the number of potential candidates. The potential cluster locations to conduct the entrance exam are; Addis Ababa, Bahir Dar, Hawassa, Dessie, Mekelle, Jimma and Jigjiga. You can choose any exam center you prefer. Candidates are required to select the preferred (proximity) exam center among the lists. There is no restriction on the exam center, and candidates can choose the preferred exam center (Note to select maximum of three exam centers based on preference rank). The exact exam centers will be decided based on the actual number of potential candidates who reached this stage. If the number of shortlisted candidates at a particular exam center is very low, the center may not be used. In this case, the affected candidates will be given another chance to select the closest available exam center.

Step 6: Supportive documents

Applicants are required to upload supportive documents. There are four sections to upload the required documents.

- The first section is to upload the **First Degree temporary and Student copy**. Note that **only scanned PDF/JPEG** documents are acceptable to upload here.
- The fellowship program accepts **ONLY UNEMPLOYED** graduates. Candidates are required to attach a **letter of unemployment** provided by the authorized government administration that is their sub-city or Kebele administration office. Letter of unemployment which is **NOT MORE THAN THREE MONTHS** will be accepted. Any unemployment letter that will be more than three months is **NOT** acceptable. The letter of unemployment can be uploaded in PDF/JPEG format. The letter of unemployment **must be written in Amharic or English**.



- The third required attachment to be uploaded is “**Curriculum Vitae**” of the candidates NOT more than three pages. The CV must be uploaded only in PDF format.
- Candidates are required to submit a one pager motivation letter and only PDF format attachment is acceptable to upload.

Step 7: Completion and Application Submission

This is the final step of your application for the fellowship program. Before you submit, you must read and accept the following two statements. Click the box below to accept the statements for both “**Certification**” and “**Declaration**”.
